

Psalm 71

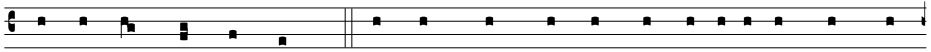
*In te, Domine, speravi*

IN THEE, O Lord, have I put my trust, let me never be put to confusion: but  
rid me and deliver me in thy righteousness, \*incline thine ear unto me, and  
save me. 2. Be thou my strong hold, whereunto I may always resort: thou hast  
promised to help me, for thou art my house of defence and my castle. 3. De-  
liver me, O my God, out of the hand of the ungodly: out of the hand of the  
unrighteous and cruel man. 4. For thou, O Lord God, art the thing that I  
long for: thou art my hope, even from my youth. 5. Through thee have I been  
holden up ever since I was born: thou art he that took me out of my mother's  
womb; \*my praise shall be always of thee. 6. I am become as it were  
a monster unto many: but my sure trust is in thee. 7. O let my mouth be  
filled with thy praise: that I may sing of thy glory and honour all the day  
long. 8. Cast me not away in the time of age: forsake me not when my  
strength faileth me. 9. For mine enemies speak against me, \*and they that lay

wait for my soul take their counsel together, saying: God hath forsaken him;

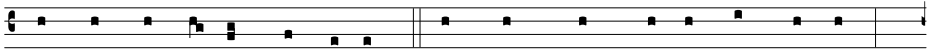
\*persecute him, and take him, for there is none to de-liv-er him. 10. Go not  
far from me, O God: my God, haste thee to help me. 11. Let them be confound-  
ed and perish that are against my soul: let them be covered with shame and

always: and will praise thee more and more<sup>13</sup>. My mouth shall daily speak of  
thy righteousness and salvation: for I know no end thereof. 14. I will go forth  
in the strength of the Lord God: and will make mention of thy righteousness  
only.<sup>15</sup> Thou, O God, hast taught me from my youth up until now: therefore  
will I tell of thy wondrous works. 16. Forsake me not, O God, in mine old age,  
when I am gray-headed: until I have shewed thy strength unto this genera-  
tion, \*and thy power to all them that are yet for to come. 17. Thy righteousness,  
O God, is very high: and great things are they that thou hast done; O God,



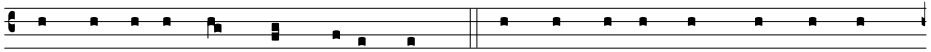
who is like un - to thee? 18. O what great troubles and adversities hast thou



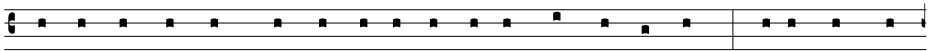
shewed me, \*and yet didst thou turn and refresh me: yea, and broughtest me



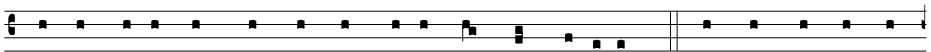
from the deep of the earth again19. Thou hast brought me to great honour:



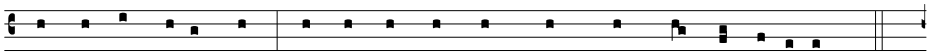
and comforted me on ev'ry side.20. Therefore will I praise thee and thy



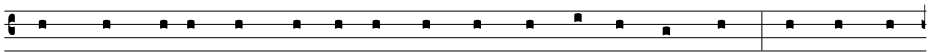
faithfulness, O God, \*playing up-on an instrument of musick: unto thee will



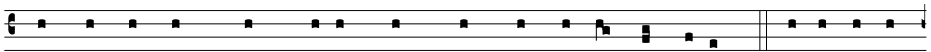
I sing upon the harp, O thou Holy One of Is-rael. 21. My lips will be fain



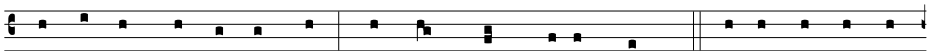
when I sing unto thee: and so will my soul whom thou hast de-livered.



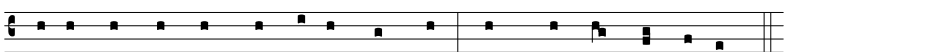
22. My tongue al-so shall talk of thy righteousness all the day long: for they are
