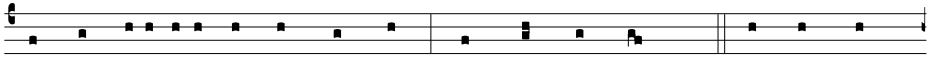

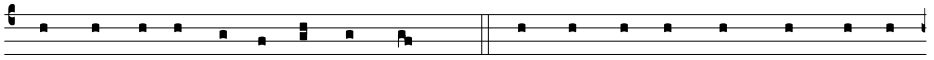

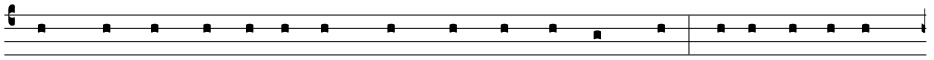
O HOW amiable are thy dwellings: thou Lord of hosts! 2. My soul hath



a desire and longing to en-ter in-to the courts of the Lord: my heart and



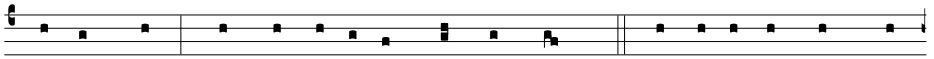
my flesh rejoice in the liv-ing God. 3. Yea, the sparrow hath found her an



house, and the swallow a nest where she may lay her young: ev-en thy altars,



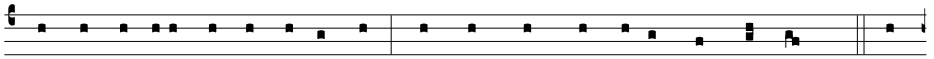
O Lord of hosts, my King and my God. 4. Blessed are they that dwell

vale of misery use it for a well: and the pools are filled with wa-ter. 7. They



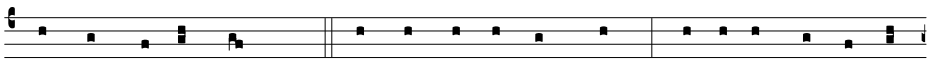
will go from strength to strength: and unto the God of gods appeareth every
